The Guide Centre is situated on the edge of the Myre Car Park in the centre of Forfar, immediately behind St. Margaret's Church (a previous venue for Ali's workshops). Ample parking is available and is free.

Registration will be from 9.30am onwards and a cup of tea or coffee and home baking will be available from 9.30 until 10am. There will also be a coffee break later in the morning.

Lunch is not included in the price of the workshop. If you wish to bring a packed lunch it will be possible to stay in the hall during the lunch break (from approximately 1pm to 2pm). Alternatively, a number of workshop participants usually go for a pub lunch in Forfar, and there are a wide variety of pubs, hotels, coffee shops and take-away options in Forfar.

Prices:

The workshop will cost £15 for the full day, or £12 for concessions and Angus Folk members. Children under 16 are very welcome to attend the workshop if accompanied by an adult. The price for children is £8 for the full day. Half-day attendance for the workshop is not recommended and this year the full fee will be charged for those who participate for less than the full duration of the workshop. Please bring the exact money with you if possible since change is not always available. Cheques can be made payable to "Angus Folk".

Alison Burns has published collections of her songs (multi-part scored books with accompanying CDs) and these can be purchased directly from Ali on the day of the workshop if anyone is interested.
